## What is Alternative Care?

Alternative Care provides <u>family-based residential care, routine, physical,</u> <u>mental, emotional and spiritual support to children in need</u> of protection and out of home placement, inclusive of:

Customary Care: Care and supervision of a First Nation, Inuit or Métis child by a person who is not the child's parent, according to the custom of the child's band or First Nation, Inuit or Métis community.

Alternative Care: The provision on a daily basis of all the essential elements of family life that a child/youth needs. The child/youth can be quite readily integrated into the alternative caregiver's family and have their needs met by following the family's normal daily routines.

Kinship Care: Pre-existing relationship between the alternative caregiver and the child/youth that requires out-of-home placement. May be a familial relationship or an adult with no blood relation, clan affiliation, but who has played a significant role in the life of the affected child/youth.
