The child/youth is surrounded by family and Community reflecting the Anishinabek belief that family is the foundation of community. Our traditional teachings see the four directions as sacred because each direction gives us special gifts and teaches that we must always respect the four directions and the gifts they bring.

Totale (Grand Totale)

The Anishinabek belief of wholeness is symbolized by the circle, family, and community. The life cycle is a circle that shows our lives from infant to Elder. Wellness includes our body, mind, heart, and spirit, which are the mental, emotional, spiritual, and physical parts of self that are shown in the four quadrants of the medicine wheel.

Niijaansinaanik Child and Family Services will ensure that families are provided visits in a timely, supportive, and responsive manner following an Alternative Care placement or family separation.

The Family Support team provides services in two key areas:

- In-home family support/reunification
- Family visiting
