Ahniin, Boozhoo Kina Weya,

This is the time of storytelling and sharing our history through the sacred words of our ancestors. These words have medicine that heal the heart and ignite our spirit and understanding of the sacred dance of life. It is a time of seeing our place through the reflection in the ancestral eyes of our past and looking forward through the awe of our children's imagination and dreams for our future.

The stars are at their brightest and the constellations and the spirit path are clearly

visible in the long night sky. This is the time of storytelling, teachings and singing important songs. Families are close and the storytellers, usually grandparents and sometimes clan leaders share historical family and clan stories.

Most of the Earth, animals, and plants, are asleep at this time and you will be able to hear the quiet voice of the Great Spirit if you listen. The spirits are dancing and some say you can see this when you see the Northern lights.
