Ahniin, Boozhoo Kina Weya,

The snow begins to melt during the day and freezes at night. It signals the beginning of Spring. The crusted allows for some walking on top of the snow.The temperature changes also signal to Ninaatig (Maple tree) to flow sap. In other areas of Anishinaabek territory this time of year is also called Sugar Moon. The Maple trees releasing their sap. Mkwa showed man how to pierce the bark to allow the sap to flow by digging Mkwa's claws into the bark and slurp up the sap dripping from the tree. This was very helpful to Man who was learning how to survive the long cold winters. The sap was a welcome gift to give man strength after he was weakened from the harsh winter.

Winter tips- Infant

- Dress your baby in layers and add blankets over top once he or she is safely buckled.
- Bulky coats and bunting bags are not safe for the car seat.
- The harness should be flat with no twists.
- Place the car seat in the back seat, facing the back of the vehicle
- Always check your manual before installing your car seat


Wiisnidaa- Let's eat!

Maple candy – Ziisbaakdoonhs

- Bring maple syrup to a boil in the saucepan over medium-high heat, stirring occasionally, until syrup reaches 235 degrees F (110 degrees C).
- Remove from heat and cool to 175 degrees F (80 degrees C) without stirring, about 10 minutes.
- Stir mixture rapidly with a wooden spoon until thick, creamy, and lighter in color, about 5 minutes.
